School Life

Arrangements for Wednesday 4th September:

- Please bring your child to the hall for 8:45 am. The Year 3 teachers will meet their classes here.
- Parents can wait outside for a member of staff to take you round the school to show you routes & where to collect from.

Normal routines:

- School day begins at 8:45am with registration at 8:50. School day finishes at 3:20pm
- At the end of the day pupils are collected from the classroom door.
- Can meet elsewhere let the teacher know. Make sure your child knows where!

Healthy lifestyle:

- We strongly encourage a healthy lifestyle and children are encouraged to bring healthy lunches and snacks to school. (crisps, chocolate & sweets are not allowed)
- Children are encouraged to drink plenty of water they are allowed to have a plastic
 bottle of water with them in the classroom.



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Year 3 Curriculum

History: Ancient Egypt & Stone Age to Iron Age

Geography: Local Area, UK, Europe, Nepal

Science: Light, Skeletons, Solids, liquids & gases, Magnets, Plants, Rocks & Soils

French - introducing key vocabulary and applying to common themes.

We also have regular PSHE, RE, Design Technology, Music, Art and PE lessons, covering a wide range of subjects in line with the National Curriculum - you can find out more at the start of the year meetings in September.



Times Tables

At Portway, we want to really engage the children so that they enjoy and are excited to learn their tables. It is so beneficial to the children's maths if they are confident with finding multiplication and division number facts.



Children are able to practice using web games such as Times Table Rockstar and on Education City. Your child's login is their email address an their passwords will be found on a sticker inside their diary.

Maths Homework
We ask that children practise their times
tables at home at least 4 times a week.





Every child will bring home a levelled reading book. We use Big Cats and Project X reading schemes.

If your child is in the earlier stages of learning to read, using phonics, then they will receive phonics support in school and will bring home a Read, Write, Inc book. These children will receive priority reading support.

There is a daily opportunity to change books and we encourage children to develop their independence in doing this.

Children will regularly have the opportunity to go to our school libraries.

Reading Homework
We ask that children read to you for at least
10 minutes, 4 times a week.



Spelling at Portway

There will be **no weekly spelling test**. Your child will not bring a list of words home. Instead, low stakes assessment is embedded within regular lessons.

You can support your child with spelling at home by talking about spelling rules, finding words that match spelling patterns and playing spelling games.

There will be a weekly update on Google Classroom to let you know which spelling rules have been covered that week.

There is an additional optional half termly homework menu.

We will be learning how to **tell the time** in Maths. Practice this skill at home on analogue and digital clocks! Pick a day and write a list of the things you do and at what times. <u>Time - KS2 Maths - BBC Bitesize</u>

In **PSHE**, we are talking about 'Relationships'. Draw and write about someone in your life who makes you feel special.

Create a **book review** of a book you have enjoyed reading recently.

We are learning about **fractions of amounts** in maths. Log onto <u>Education City</u> using the details in the front of your diary. Go to Homework and complete the fractions pathway.

Our **French** unit is about clothes. Teach our new vocabulary to your family!

Draw a **comic strip** of an event that happens in The Secret Garden. Add dialogue.

In **Computing**, we are learning about branching databases. You can use the website to create these at home: <u>j2data (j2e.com)</u>

In RE we are learning about the Jewish Harvest festival of Shavuot. List 5 ways Jewish people celebrate this event.



• Home / School diaries:

Our home/school diaries are really important:


- A good communication between home and school - it should be brought in every day
- Passwords
- Notes or reminders from home medical appointments etc can be written in for the teacher to see
- Keep a record of reading & times table practice completed at home. We check diaries every Friday and celebrate when children have read & practised times tables 4 times a week.
- The list of words pupils need to know how to spell in Years 3&4 and Years 5&6
 - Lots of other useful information general knowledge facts, maps & grammar definitions.

The Admin Team are here to help!





- If your child is ill, please leave a message on the school's answerphone to inform us of your child's absence and what is wrong with them.
 - It is a legal requirement to follow this absence message up with a signed and dated note on your child's return to school, please email this to the school office.
- We have a clear attendance policy and this can be seen on our website. In line with Hampshire County Council policy, term-time holidays will only be approved in exceptional circumstances. Absence request forms are available from the office.
- If your contact details have changed since you applied, please let us know

Other information:

The Admin Team are here to help!

- The registration forms have been sent via a link to a Googleform. Please can we ask that this information is completed by **Friday 5th July** to give the office time to get the details on the system.
- If your child needs to attend a medical appointment, please inform the class teacher and the office. We will require a copy of the appointment letter/text/email. Please arrive 5 minutes before you need to collect your child to give the office staff time to get them from their classroom.
- The admin staff are happy to administer medicines to your child if necessary. Please bring medicine to the school office, in its original packaging, so that you can complete the necessary form. We are happy to email you a form to complete at home if this is easier. Please do not send medicine in with your child. Medicine can only be collected by an adult.
- Breakfast Club available before school 8:00 8:45am. £2 per day. From September children will need to be booked on. Runs in the school dining room.
- **Portway Plus+** is our after school club, which runs every day during term time until 5.30. It is currently £11 per session. You will need to complete a separate registration form and agreements. Sessions are booked and prepaid online via Scopay (same system that Portway Infants use). We are able to accept childcare vouchers, you just need to let us know which voucher provider you use.

School dinners - £2.80 per day. £14 per week.

- Payment to be made online to Dolce via the School Grid Details to follow
- You can see the menu and order your meals via the school grid in advance.
- We will double check the children have ordered in class every morning
- Parents can order/amend their option online upto 8:45am every morning
- Packed lunches: please ensure these are healthy and balanced meals. Sweets, chocolate and fizzy drinks are not allowed.
- If you already claim free school meals, then this information will be transferred over from your child's infant school. If you are not sure whether you are eligible, please talk to one of us, or check online at Online FSM Application
