Moving from Infant School to Junior School.

The transition from Infant to Junior School can be both exciting and challenging

Helping your child (and you!) feel more prepared and less anxious

- Be guided by your child
- Be aware of how you feel
 - Be positive
 - Be available
- Be mindful of changes in behaviour

If your child is feeling wobbly, you are not alone and there are things you can do to support them



Some suggestions

- Keep the routine steady. Stick to familiar daily rhythms.
- **Talk little and often** short, low pressure chats help build connection and confidence.
- Visit the school Familiarity reduces anxiety.

Open afternoon - Thursday 17 July 3:00-4:00pm. Pop in to say hello to new Y3 teachers!

- Focus on one skill at a time Yeah! you remembered your reading journal today.
- Validate feelings I understand, it's okay to feel like that.
- Offer reassurance Gently and often.
- Celebrate the end of infants- Marking the end makes space for a new beginning.



Post-transition: what you may notice

- There may be a honeymoon period.
- Expect wobbles.
- Wanting to be more independent.
- Becoming socially and emotionally more aware.
- Friendships become more important. You will see more fallouts! This is a normal stage of development
- Negotiation and conflict resolution skills are developed through play.





- We strongly encourage a healthy lifestyle and children are encouraged to bring healthy lunches and snacks to school (crisps, chocolate & sweets are not allowed).
- Children are encouraged to drink plenty of water they are allowed to have a plastic bottle of water with them in the classroom.


- Every child will bring home a levelled reading book. We use Big Cat and Project X reading schemes.
- If your child is in the earlier stages of learning to read, using phonics, then they will receive phonics support in school and will bring home a Read, Write, Inc book. These children will receive priority reading support.
- There is a daily opportunity to change books and we encourage children to develop their independence in doing this.
- Children will regularly have the opportunity to go to our school libraries.

Reading Homework



We ask that children read to you for at least 10 minutes, 4 times a week.

Reading Journals











We believe reading should be fun, exciting, and something to be proud of. To help build a lifelong love of reading, we are launching **Portway Page Turners** – our brand new reading for pleasure initiative. How it works:

- Every year 3 child will receive a Reading Journal to track their reading sessions at home and in school.
- As children log their reading sessions, they will work towards earning special Portway Page Turner Badges.







Each week, children will receive reading and maths homework that reflects the learning they've covered in class. This allows them to consolidate their understanding and practise independently at home. Homework is set weekly and children will have a full week to complete it. To support this, a lunchtime homework club is available once a week with a flexible, drop-in approach. Children who do not complete their homework are encouraged to attend and use this time to catch up in a supportive environment.

It is recommended that around 20 minutes is spent on homework.



Times tables

At Portway, we want to really engage the children so that they enjoy and are excited to learn their tables. It is so beneficial to the children's maths if they are confident with finding multiplication and division number facts.



Children are able to practice using web games such as Times Table Rockstar. Your child's login will be their Portway Junior email address and their password will be found on a sticker inside their journal.

Maths Homework



We ask that children practise their times tables at home at least 4 times a week.

It is a legal requirement to follow this absence message up with a signed and dated note on your child's return to school, please email this to the school office.



The Admin Team are here to help!

• The registration forms have been sent via a link to a Googleform. Please can we ask that this information is completed by **Friday 5th July** to give the office time to get the details on the system.



- **Medicines** Admin staff are happy to administer medicines to children if needed. Please bring medicine to the school office, in its original packaging and complete the necessary form. We are happy to email a form home to complete. Medicine must be brought to and collected from school by an adult.
- **Breakfast Club** available Monday Friday term time 8:00 8:45am in the school dining hall. £2 per day, Children will need to be booked on and sessions paid via Arbor. If your child is on school site unaccompanied before 8:40am, they must be in breakfast club. Children should not be unaccompanied on site before 8:35am.
- Portway Plus+ After School Club. Monday Friday term time 3:20 5.30 in the school dining room. Currently £11 per session. A separate registration form and agreement must be completed. Sessions are booked and prepaid online via Arbor. We accept childcare vouchers, you just need to let us know which voucher provider you use.
- Music Lessons £80 per term, payable in advance, Guitar and woodwind available. Waiting list for piano.

School dinners - £3.00 per day. £15 per week.

- Payment to be made online to Dolce via School Grid
- Advance viewing of menus and of booking meals
- We will double check the children have ordered in class every morning
- Parents can order/amend their option online upto 8:55 am every morning
- Packed lunches: please ensure these are healthy and balanced meals. Sweets, chocolate and fizzy drinks are not allowed.
- If you already claim free school meals, then this information will be transferred over from your child's infant school. If you are not sure whether you are eligible, please talk to one of us, or check online at <u>Online FSM Application</u>






We use the Arbor Parent Portal. This helps you to:
