Homework update: We want all our children to understand and remember what they learn in school, so they can use it in all subjects and in their everyday lives and we want to see all of them make great progress.

Research shows that homework can really boost a child's learning. In primary school, it can add about three months' worth of progress, and even more in secondary school. That's why we believe setting effective homework now is so important. Not only does it help your child learn better today, but it also prepares them for success in secondary school by building good study habits. We have been revising our approach to homework

and, in the summer term will be introducing this ready for a full launch in the new academic year.

What We're Keeping:

- Reading & Times Tables: practising reading & times tables, at least 4 times a week is crucial.
- Weekly Homework: Homework will be assigned every week

• Homework Clubs: We'll still offer homework clubs for children who prefer to work at school or need extra support.

What We're Changing to Help Your Child Even More:

- Focused Homework: Instead of a menu of optional projects, we'll focus on weekly Maths and English tasks to target the most important skills.
- Homework Books: Your child will complete their homework in a special exercise book, which will be brought back to school for checking. It should be in school everyday.
- Consistent routine: Homework will be given out every Thursday and due the following Thursday, for all year groups.
- Time Limit: We ask that your child spend 30-45 minutes on their homework. After that, they should stop. This helps us see what they can achieve in a reasonable amount of time.
- **Reinforcing Learning:** Homework will help your child practice and remember what they've already learned in class.
- Digital Resources: We'll continue to use Google Classroom to share any texts for reading so we can reduce paper use. If you require a paper copy, please ask your child's class teacher.

What You Can Do to Help:

- Encourage your child to read daily.
- Help them find a quiet space to do their homework and remind them to work for 30-45 minutes and then stop.
- Check Google Classroom for any reading materials or questions & encourage them in fun and creative ways
