Challenges

- The cost £400 approx. (£50 increase from the year before)
- Calshot's own cuts e.g. staffing, food, activities available, bedding
- Evening activities
- The site based across two houses, an 8 minute walk apart. The children only saw one half of the year group.
- Safeguarding the public, number of instructors, medical/first aid across two houses
